### **Pinetop Perkins - Chicago Blues Legend Always Impresses His Audience**



Pinetop Perkins is more than a legend. As a Bluesman whose career has spanned several generations of Blues, Pinetop is an oral history of the Blues. Beginning in the 1940s when he played with Robert Nighthawk and Sonny Boy Williamson, then working with Muddy Waters and James Cotton in the 1960s, up to today when he toams up with Willia "Big Even"

the 1960s, up to today when he teams up with Willie "Big Eyes" Smith on his latest tour, the man is unstoppable. At 96 years young, yes, that's right, 96, he commands the keyboards as he pounds out some of the best Chicago Blues ever created.

Pinetop Perkins' latest show at the State Theatre in Falls Church, VA, on March 5 (a show postponed from February because of the snow), opened with Willie "Big Eyes" Smith (photos on right), playing harmonica, leading the backing band which consisted of Jimmy

Mayes on drums (Willie's instrument for most of his career), Bob Stroger on bass and Little Frank Krakowski playing a Gibson Les Paul guitar. After a couple tunes, Willie brought out local boogie woogie piano great Daryl Davis to play keys. Together they went through several Chicago Blues standards and after teasing the crowd a few times the band finally brought out Pinetop, nattily dressed in a 3-piece charcoal suit with matching fedora and a keyboard-print tie.

Pinetop sat at the keys that Daryl warmed up for him. Pinetop still keeps time with the band, handling the vocals on several tunes. A couple times Pinetop complained about the keyboard (a Kurzweil) being out of tune, but master musician that he is, he handled it with grace, playing classics like "Got My Mojo Workin'," "Down in Mississippi," and more. All in all, a great time was had by a large and highly appreciative audience. *Article by Elliot Gross and Chris Deproperty. Photos by Elliot Gross*.

, Willie "Big Eyes" Smith is also a legend in his own right. He was the drummer in Muddy Waters Band from 1961 to 1964, and from 1968-1980. He appears on all of Muddy Waters' GRAMMY-winning albums. After performing as a member of Muddy's band, Willie co-founded the Legendary Blues Band with Pinetop Perkins, Louis Myers, Calvin Jones, and Jerry Portnoy.



### Memphis Gold – Featured on American Blues News Website & on Block Magazine Cover

Memphis Gold headlined the DCBS-sponsored 1st Annual Silver Spring Blues Festival in 2009. He has also performed at other DCBS events, and he will be performing at the DCBS-sponsored Nadine Rae Benefit on April 11 at the Silver Spring American Legion (see p. 12). Memphis' reputation extends beyond the DC area, however, and he was recently profiled on the American Blues News (ABN) Website. ABN is a Website that covers American Blues artists, music, and reviews. ABN has correspondents from across the country, and the Washington, DC area correspondent is known as The Virginiabluesman. On March 12, ABN posted Virginiabluesman's story and interview with Chester "Memphis Gold" Chandler. The Virginiabluesman told his Gold is a major force in the Blues world today. If it's authentic, fiery, blazing Blues you want, Memphis is the man."

As noted in the ABN article, Memphis Gold will be on the cover of *Block* magazine (the current issue), which is a long-standing Blues magazine published in the Netherlands. ### **April 2010**

### Marva Wright – March 20, 1948 – March 23, 2010

The Blues world is reeling from the loss of Marva Wright, who passed away in Louisiana at age 62, from complications of a stroke suffered last year. Marva is survived by six children, eleven grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Wright was known for her gospel spirituals and bawdy Blues. She recorded on US and international record labels and performed tours around the world. She always drew large crowds at her events due to her dynamic presentations. Fans often called her "Marvalous Marva." She started singing to support her family but found that singing on Bourbon Street in New Orleans led to tours in Europe and many other places in the world, as word of her passionate Blues and gospel performances boosted her popularity.

Wright's first public singing efforts, at the age of nine, were in church with her mother as her accompanist. Successful singing competitions at school followed. She credited her mother, a piano player and singer in a gospel quartet, as one of her main influences. Mahalia Jackson, who was a friend of the family, was also a great inspiration.

Wright's first recording was "Mama, He Treats Your Daughter Mean." She made her debut on national television in 1991 when her hometown was the setting for a special that revolved around the Super Bowl. Heartbreakin' Woman, Wright's first full-length release, appeared later that year and garnered honors from the Louisiana Music Critics Association as Blues Album of the Year.

The DC Blues Society recalls that Wright and her husband and children evacuated New Orleans and came to Maryland after Hurricane Katrina. They lost everything but the clothes on their backs. In the fall of 2006, they resettled in Louisiana. She was known as the "Blues Queen of New Orleans," and performed there often. After suffering two strokes in 2009, however, she was not able to resume performing. We are certainly going to miss you "Marvelous Marva" Wright.

### Update on Roy Carrier's Health

Roy Carrier is a Zydeco phenomenon known to many DCBS members. Roy and the Night Rockers, his band, have played often in the DC area. Roy has been described as a "Blues showman in a Zydeco suit" (Thomas Schulte, music journalist and radio personality, Michigan). Roy's Website (www.rovcarrier.com) provides the following update, as of March 7, 2010, regarding Roy's current health situation: "Roy is set to finish the last of his radiation/chemo treatments next week and all indicates are the treatment has taken. He will have scans done after the treatment and then wait 6 months for a check up on that. But he is still having circulation issues with his right leg and there is ongoing concern about that. The Blues Foundation will publicly honor the legend with a one-of-a-kind original artwork (see right) and a special musical tribute. Past recipients of this prestigious award include Bobby "Blue" Bland, Ruth Brown, Ray Charles, Ahmet Ertegun, John Lee Hooker, Etta James, B.B. King, Sam Phillips, Koko Taylor and Jerry Wexler.

Buddy began his music career in the 1950's in Baton Rouge. When he made his way to Chicago and established himself, he began hanging with the likes of Freddy King, Muddy Waters, Otis Rush, and Magic Sam. He recorded 2 sin-

gles for Cobra Records, "This is the End" and "Try to Quit You Baby." When Cobra folded, he went to Chess records, with his first Chess single released in 1960. He recorded "First Time I Met the Blues," and followed it up with "Broken Hearted Blues." In 1991, he won a GRAMMY and began really picking up steam, with sell-out performances and many television interviews. His Blues Singer album in 2003 won him another GRAMMY. 2005's Bring 'Em In, 2008's Skin Deep, and 2009's Snakebite continued Buddy's inimitable style.

With his feet in both the Blues and rock camps, his style has been distinct and consistent throughout his career. Buddy has been nominated for 41 Blues Music Awards and has received 28 of those Awards. His Windy City club is the most successful Blues joint Poster-www.blues.org



in Chicago. He is surely the Windy City's reigning Blues artist. SPECIAL NOTE- Buddy will appear at the Chesapeake Bay Blues Festival on May 22.

### April Performances by Ruthie Foster and John Hammond At Rams Head and Wolf Trap

Ruthie Foster and John Hammond, two Blues artists who were recent GRAMMY Nominees, will both perform on two evenings in April - on



Tuesday, April 6 at the Rams Head Tavern in Annapolis, and on Wednesday, April 7, at The Barns at Wolf Trap. In college, Ruthie Foster fronted a Blues band in different venues from Dallas to San Antonio. After immersing herself in music for years, she joined the Navy to do something different, but soon found herself as a member of Pride, a Navy ensemble that played the Top 40 and funk hits of the day at recruitment drives. Her music career continued after her military service and has flourished, with five albums to date. Her 2009 album, The Truth According to Ruthie Foster, was a 2009 GRAMMY Award nominee for Best Contemporary Blues Album. www.ruthiefoster.com

John Hammond is a 2010 GRAMMY Nominee for his 33rd album, Rough & Tough (Best Traditional Blues Album). He recorded his first album in 1962, was a 1985 GRAMMY Winner, a GRAMMY Nominee for 5 addi-

tional albums, and a Blues Music Award Winner in 2004 & 2003 for Best Acoustic Blues Artist, and in 2002 for Best Acoustic Album for his Tom Waits produced Wicked Grin. 
