

Wins Battle of the Bands to Represent DCBS at IBC

Two seasoned local blues musicians will be heading back to Memphis for the International Blues Challenge (IBC) after their new band, DC Mudd, won the DC Blues Society's Annual Battle of the Bands on Oct. 10.

Bass player David Jackson and guitarist David Oziel represented the DC Blues Society at the International Blues Challenge in January after winning the DCBS Solo/Duo Competition last year. Now they'll return this January with DC Mudd to compete in the band category during the 2016 IBC. "It's very exciting," Oziel told the CAPITAL BLUES MESSENGER. "This is only the third time we played as a band," Jackson added.

The DC Blues Society is a non-profit 501(c)(3)organization dedicated to keeping the Blues alive through outreach and education. The DC Blues Society is a proud affiliate of the Blues Foundation.

entrants. However, this year there are five competitors. Along with the growing number of acts, an enthusiastic audience has been growing, too. I strongly suggest you don't miss the contest. Price is no barrier. It's free! We

DC Mudd and the Solo/Duo winner would appreciate and be inspired by seeing some of you at the IBC in January. He has been active in the region and toured nationally and internationally. He performed at the DCBS Aug. 8 Festival Fundraiser and his CD was reviewed in the July CBM.

Alex is a 10-year-old junior at Stephen Decatur HS in Ocean City, MD. He got his first real drum kit at age 5 and his first real guitar at 7, and aspires to a music career. Martin O'Malley, when he made a surprise appearance to play guitar and sing at an OC venue.

As soon as DC Mudd took the stage, it was clear the band was tight even though it's only a few months old. The band chose its name to honor legendary bluesman Muddy Waters and focused on traditional blues songs like the mournful "Go Back to Mother Earth" and "Cut You Loose."

In addition to former duo winners Jackson and Oziel, the band comprises Adam Oppenheim on guitar, Howard Moss on harmonica, and Phil Schaeffer on drums.

Moondog Medicine Show, a Western Maryland band with a blues rock sound, ranked second in the competition. Moondog's lead singer, Lana Spence, has a huge voice, and she put her saucy vocal power to good use covering Etta James and Denise LaSalle, including a convincing version of "Your Husband Is Cheating on Us." Spence was backed by drummer Danny Tait and guitarist Joel Newman and bass player Keith Sylvester, who were decked out in fancy vests and black hats.

Shakedown, which came in third place, also featured a powerful female vocalist. Vocalist Gayle Weaver Harrod, guitarists Bill Grimes and Scott Reda, bass player Kevin Armstrong, and drummer Sean Watkins presented several blues classics, including "Hoochie Coochie Man," "Little By Little," and "Five Long Years."

Cooking With Gas opened the night with its signature upbeat style punctuated with harmonica and humor from frontman "Takoma Dave" Rothman. The band, which also features Roy Brooks on guitar, Jim "Cookie" Cooke on bass, and Nelson Garcia on drums, played various forms of blues, ranging from the soulful "Lonely Avenue"

to their ironically

dramatic version of "How Come My Dog Don't Bark When You Come Around?" Cooking With Gas also presented three original songs, including the whimsical "I Like My Women Like I Like My Coffee."

The fifth band to compete was **Twelve Bars on Monday.** Consisting of guitarist Vince Vigliotti, Chris Berry on bass and Larry Hale on drums, Twelve Bars on Monday presented a largely rocklike sound with a slightly bluesy flavor. They performed an original and a B.B. King song, but the audience at the Wheaton American Legion flocked to the dance floor when Berry let loose with "I'm Torn Down." They also did "The House Is A-Rocking" and "Messing With The Kid."

Each band played a 40-minute set, giving the audience a good taste of each. WPFW radio

personality Dr. Nick emceed the show, and Dr. Feelgood worked the sound board. The bands were judged on the basis of their blues content (weight of 4), vocals (weight of 3), instrumental talent (weight of 3), originality (weight of 2), and stage presence (weight of 2).

There were five judges: Darren Johnson, lead singer and guitarist for the Mojo Priests, who won the band competition last year; Bret Littlehales, singer and harmonica player for the Big Boy Little band, which won the competition in 2009; Joe "E-Flat" Thomas, a saxophonist who plays with Big Daddy Stallings (whose band competed in the 2008 IBC as the DCBS entry); Lady Myrrh

(Muriel Cauthen), a singer/songwriter who does programming for WPFW (89.3 FM); and Bill Hennessey, a DCBS member and dance enthusiast.

As the winner, DC Mudd will represent the DC Blues Society at the 32nd International Blues Challenge, to be held January 26 through 30 in Memphis.

Method to My Madness Tommy Castro & The Painkillers

There might be a *Method To My Madness*, the new Alligator album by Tommy Castro & The Painkillers. Castro is a fairly reliable artist who brings his husky, slightly gravelly vocals and rocking guitar to a disc with ten originals and a couple of choice covers. The Painkillers, which includes Michael Emerson on keyboards, Randy McDonald on bass, and Bowen Brown on drums, with Ari Rios also on percussion, is a pretty well-oiled



machine. There are no surprises on this unlike his last album, *The Devil You Know*, which had a few hard rock tracks that fell flat to these ears.

Castro writes clever songs with an ability to generate a lyrical hook. Certainly the opening "Common Ground," with its call for us


Apply to become a member of the DCBS Board.

Candidates for the vacant Secretary position are especially needed. to stand together on common ground, band together before we all fall down, displays this. The title track is a

catchy rocker where he tells this lady that he is blinded with desire for her and there is a method to his pursuit of her. It is followed by a ballad where he sings about having "Died

and Gone To Heaven," when he is with the one he loves. The rocker "Got a Lot," has a rocking groove and one could easily imagine this being done by a zydeco band.

As good as these songs may be, the wonderfully paced shuffle "Two Hearts" and a cover of the Muscle Shoals soul classic "I'm Qualified" stand out as exceptional (the latter perhaps having Castro's finest vocal here).



Also strong is "Lose Lose," a slow blues that Castro co-wrote with Joe Louis Walker, with a nice lyric and terrific guitar.

Method To My Madness closes with a rendition

of B.B. King's "Bad Luck." Castro toured with King years ago and this solid cover, done in tribute, closes a very appealing recording.

DC Mudd, the winner of the 2015 DCBS Battle of the Bands, is actually a recently formed band that first evolved this summer, when Jackson and Oziel, the DCBS 2014 Solo/Duo Competition winner, put the group together to fill an opening band slot at an event. (see page 1) The band went on to perform at several events and had so much fun they threw their hat into the Battle of the Bands competition and won! The name, DC Mudd, was chosen to reflect the band's respect for the body of work of blues legend Muddy Waters. The band includes David Jackson (bass, vocals), David Oziel (guitar, vocals), Adam Oppenheim (guitar), Howard Moss (harmonica), and Phil Schaeffer (drums).

Ron Hicks Project is a band viewed as one of the best Blues/Jazz bands in the Metro area. The varied vocal talents from several members of the band give it a distinctive and aggressive



song flavor. The band's sounds show the influences of Ronnie Brooks, Nelson Adelard Band, Albert Collins, and Buddy Guy. Dr. Ron C. Hicks is

music director, songwriter, plays guitar, and provides lead vocals. Other members include Herbie Wheatley (sax/flute/vocals/congas), James Anderson (drums), Rob Rutherburg Farris (bass), Glen Alexander (guitar/vocals), and John O (sax). The Ron Hicks Project music is spiced in the south, cooked in Chicago and served in the DMV. www.facebook. com/Ron-Hicks-Project Jesi Terrell and The Love Mechanic Band includes the rising songstress, Jesi, who was born and raised in the city of Chicago, where her love



of music began from singing in the church choir. Today, she is a contemporary R&B superstar. One cannot help but notice her voice. She delivers a cutting edge, sultry sound, sweetened around the edges. Jesi has shared the stage in concerts with some of the top names in music, including Bobby Blue Bland, Peggy Scott Adam, and Little Milton. She has also worked with Betty Wright, Koko Taylor, and Willie Clayton, and has opened for B.B. King, Eric Clapton, and many more. In 2009, Jesi moved to Washington, DC, where she formed her band, which she has affectionately named "The Love Mechanic Band." The LMB is a high energy, funky blues, and soul band. Other band members are John Potts (lead guitar), Teddy

(drums), Glen Kerridge (sax), Red Adkins (bass), Barry Brady (keyboard), and Jacqueline Bell and Barry Smith (background vocals). http://jesiterrell.wix.com/jesiterrell

Patty Reese has been both a fan and critic favorite of the Mid-Atlantic Region for many years. Her work has been recognized by the Washington Area Music Association, which has awarded her 16 WAMMIES, including Artist of the Year, Songwriter and Album of the year and Roots Rock Vocalist. Her latest release, Strong Medicine, held the No. 1 position in the AirPlay Direct (ADP) Charts for over three weeks and has been played on more than 700 stations worldwide. 
