Raised on Gospel and Blues, Morris is a Baltimore-based artist who rocks the Blues with a soulful core. His rock-edged style was inspired by Jimi Hendrix and B.B. King, and he's fused those influences into his unique "Boggie Woogie Rhythm and Rockin' Blues." His 2015 CD, Don't Bring Me Daylight, has received national airplay and rave reviews in the music press.

The Reggie Wayne Morris Band has toured throughout the country and internationally. The Band is also a popular fixture at the Baltimore Blues Society events. Last April, they rocked the house and stole the show, opening for the Nick Moss Band at a DCBS fundraiser.

James Walker wrote in BLUES BLAST MAG, "Reggie Wayne Morris should soon be nationally and internationally festival famous."

Funds raised from this event help the DC Blues Festival to remain a free event. This year's festival is Saturday, Sept. 3 at the Carter Barron Amphitheatre, Washington, DC. The grant from the District of Columbia government that has provided financial support for the festival is no longer available. The DCBS Festival Fundraiser on Saturday, May 7 features Reggie Wayne Morris. Reggie opened for Nick Moss at our last year's fundraiser. (However, too many of you missed a helluva lively show.) We hope to do better this year. I'll remind you again that without the DC Government grant, we rely on this fundraiser and other paid events to support the FREE Annual DC Blues Festival.

Reggie fuses the influences of Jimi Hendrix and B.B. King into his own unique approach to songwriting, guitar playing and singing. He's toured Italy, France and the U.S and has three recordings under his belt. 28th Annual Festival Lineup Finalized

It's always tough trying to come up with an interesting and dynamic Festival lineup on a shoestring budget. But because there is a wealth of undervalued talent out here, I think we've come up with a powerfully entertaining mix of talent for the Carter Barron Amphitheatre on Saturday, Sept. 3, from 12 pm to 7:30 pm. As it turned out, the line-up features three women band leaders in the middle of two male-led acts. That ought to build the fire real hot before the last act blasts off.

The Festival opens with DC Mudd, the 2015 Battle of the Bands winner. DC Mudd performed to much acclaim at the 2015 College Park Blues Festival and has been gigging around the area since they formed a short time before the 2015 Battle. Check 'em out: https://www.facebook. com/DCMuddBluesBand/

Next on the stage is the Countess Williams Band. Countess is a newcomer to the DMV, but has proven herself in Chicago, performing at venues that include Buddy Guy's Legends and Kingston Mines, and sharing the stage with Carl Weathersby and highly regarded Chicago-based bands, the Mike Wheeler Band and the Charlie Love Band. Countess' passionate delivery and versatile voice will woo you. If you don't know her now, you surely will not forget her after seeing her Festival performance. The Lauren Mitchell Band out of South Florida is up next. Lauren is a tour de force, performing around 250 dates per year, nationally and internationally. BLUES MUSIC MAGAZINE calls her, "A mesmerizing performer with a voice for the ages." Her latest CD, *Live! From The Bradfordville Blues Club*, was released in May 2014 and will give you a good taste of what to expect from her.

Jackie Scott & The Housewreckers from the Hampton Roads area fills the stage next with her big, bold voice and sometimes sassy delivery style. Jackie has opened for the likes of B.B. King, Keb' Mo', Taj Mahal and Lyle Lovett. On stage, Jackie is a dynamo, who will infect you with the powerful spirit of the Blues.

Rounding up the Festival lineup is the Omar Coleman Band out of Chicago. Omar Coleman has recorded three full albums, performed 30 international dates in 12 countries, and performed as featured vocalist for more than 10 professionally touring bands.

At a youthful 35 years old, Omar Coleman, a Chicago native, has established himself as one of the nation's premier harmonica players and blues vocalists on the scene today. He has been billed on festivals with legends like Robert Cray, Buddy Guy, Koko Taylor, Ruth Brown and Robert Randolph. Omar is known for mixing it up with his audience to share more intimately his Blues love. The Annual DC Blues Festival & Volunteering

Lately there has been some controversy about the nexus of bands' volunteering to perform free for some DCBS events and the Annual DC Blues Festival. Allow me to clarify once again: there is no nexus between the two.

Some performers think or assume that by volunteering to play for no fee at DCBS events, they should be rewarded with an appearance at the Annual Festival. I never make such a promise and explain on such occasions that a DCBS group makes the final decision on the Annual Festival lineup. I cannot predict the outcome of such decisions—the group members (DCBS Board members and Key Volunteers) listen to the Festival candidates and vote on each. The candidates with the most votes in each cost category win a slot.

For paid performances, we do consider acts who support our mission. But there is never a quid pro quo—stated or implied. We strive to get 'em in where they fit in. Ideally, musicians should support the DCBS mission by being members and volunteering their talents on occasion. DCBS is a public institution dedicated to the education and enjoyment of Blues fans and a showcase for regional acts in the DMV—a worthy objective for Blues musicians and the general public.

So, the word to all is support DCBS for what it does for the Blues not just for what it can do for you.

John Mayall at The Hamilton, March 16, 2016

I had to walk past the White House to get to The Hamilton to be a DC Blues Society volunteer for what turned out to be a great John Mayall show. The Hamilton, at the corner of 14th and F Sts., NW, and one of the DMV's top venues, is lately running more blues shows. Arlene Goldberg-Gist and I set up the Society's table and just next to us sat a serene John Mayall, who had his own table for selling and signing CDs. Between his sales and our member inquiries we were able to chat briefly.

Mayall helped inspire my own interest in the blues, back in the 1960s. He told me his earliest influences were American blues and jazzmen and he had the chance to see some in the UK in the 1950's. Perhaps inspired by that American music, he has lived in California for decades. Asked by one of the many who came up to buy his latest CD, Find a Way to Care, who his most important influence was, the gentlemanly Mayall said he couldn't pick one; he similarly declined to specify which of his own albums or which of his many collaborators were his favorite. Fan after fan thanked him for introducing them to the blues.

The remarkably spry 82-year old Mayall really came alive when he hit the stage, on time. He easily shifted between electric organ (Hammond/ Wurlitzer sound style), electric piano, guitar, and harmonica. On each, he showed continuing command of the instrument. On one number he made his piano sound like a vibraphone and it fit right in. As he has done forever, he sometimes played both harmonica and keyboard at the same time.

The material spanned much of Mayall's long career beginning with a cover of the 1962 Sonny Boy Williamson standard, "Help Me," and included "Walking on Sunset," from the Blues for Laurel Canyon album, the 1970 ecological anthem; "Nature's Disappearing" to "I Feel So Bad" and "Mother-in Law Blues,"

a likely continuation. He delighted the crowd with a wellconstructed version of "Room to Move," his harmonica and scat calling card that has become a harp standard. Chick-a chick-a boom.

Mavall's band, with which he has been playing since 2008, consisted of Texan Rocky Athas on guitar, Greg Rzab on bass, and Jay Davenport on drums, the latter two from



for sale for \$750,000. He later played a tasty bass solo that drew from funk, jazz and R&B inspiration. Athas, who played both lead and rhythm, laid down a skein of tasty licks, especially on the set closer "Hideaway," a Freddy King cover from the 1960s.

The highly listenable, even danceable, single set lasted the better part of two hours. When it was over, more satisfied listeners lined up for CDs and a picture with this seminal figure of the blues. We really enjoyed John Mayall's show, and when this historic, but still lively bluesman returns, I am sure you will too.
