Bidding farewell to Lou Hankins, former WPFW manager

Returned blues, jazz to prominence at station

Louis E. Hankins Oct. 20, 1947 – Mar. 20, 2016

Long time DC-area radio listeners will undoubtedly remember the voice of broadcaster, Lou Hankins. What they may not know is the impact he had on the numerous stations where he worked and the number of broadcasters he mentored or influenced.

After his discharge from the Marine Corps, Lou pursued a career in communications. He knew music — gospel, jazz, soul, blues — and he knew how to engage audiences. He hosted shows at WOL, WYCB, WAYE, WUST and WDCU and in 1991, he joined WPFW (89.3 FM) as program director. From 1994–2002, he was the general manager.

It was under Lou's management that WPFW returned to its musical mission with a renewed focus on jazz and blues. One of his format changes included the addition of southern soul and adult contemporary blues with Rick "Da Gator" Bolling on the Saturday schedule. He brought in other voices that were familiar to radio listeners like Bobby Bennett and "Uptown"

Janice Brown. Lou added a daily show called "Blues Plate Special" hosted by Bill Wax and a zydeco show hosted by Texas Fred, The Zydeco Cowboy.


Many with careers in broadcasting express



their thanks to Lou for his advice and encouragement. April Watts (Radio One) who was mentored by Lou said, "We encounter countless people as we journey along this life; most of them having little or no affect. Then there are those rare, beautiful individuals that you meet and your life is forever changed. I am positive that my life would've been

very different had I not met Lou Hankins. He was my best friend and I learned so much from him. The greatest lesson: You don't have to be blood to be family...."

Rest in Peace, Lou. Your legacy lives on.

God Don't Never Change — The Songs of Blind WIllie Johnson

performed by various artists

Blind Willie Johnson is generally classified among the most significant Texas country bluesmen, although he never sang about the usual subjects like women and whiskey. However, it appears he was married to two or more women simultaneously. He restricted himself to religious music, both on record and in performance in churches and street corners. Born in approximately 1902, he was blinded at the age of seven by his stepmother throwing lye in his face to retaliate against his father's infidelity. Like many of his contemporaries, he was forced to seek a living in music. He was a superb and haunting slide guitarist, often letting the guitar finish the verses wordlessly. He was also an excellent picker and sang anywhere from mid-range to a deep growl. He was discovered singing in the streets and began recording in 1927. His initial recordings outsold Bessie Smith,



but after the Great Depression hit, he never recorded after 1930. He died in obscurity in 1948 after no local hospital would treat him for pneumonia, brought on by a flood. His body of work is a unique, stark and unforgiving picture of the "old time religion."

Given this formidable challenge,

Alligator Records has assembled a diverse group of artists, mostly from rock, to rework his songs. Some try to approximate the sound, others use them more as a starting point. On the whole, they succeed. Some songs are relatively well-known, often from the work of other artists, but some are only known from Johnson. The artists provide a good introduction to a man, whose music speaks through time and space, and might encourage some listeners to get the originals.

Tom Waits growls and uses percussion to recreate the feel of "The Soul of a Man," a meditative piece and "John the Revelator," a call and response, "Who's that writing? John the Revelator. Wrote the book of the



seven seals."

Alt-country queen, Lucinda Williams, whose songs often tear into herself, is a great choice for "Nobody's Fault But Mine" and "God Don't Never Change," who she sometimes converts into a female. The only gospel artists, The Blind Boys of Alabama, cover the well-known "Mother's (Motherless) Children Have a Hard Time," with their typical call and harmonies.

Derek Trucks and Susan Tedeschi perform an acoustic version, with slide, of "Keep Your Lamp Trimmed and Burning." Sinead O'Connor is an inspired choice for "Trouble Will Soon Be Over." The Cowboy Junkies, not known for any allegiance to blues, do a nice job with "Jesus Is Coming Soon." Luther Dickinson of the North Mississippi Allstars is joined by the Mississippi Hill Country Rising Star Fife and Drum Corps for a rousing version of "Jesus Is Coming Soon."

Maria McKee, another country-influenced singer, tries a bit too hard on "Let Your Light Shine On Me." Finally, Rickie Lee Jones applies her distinctive voice to an old spiritual and sings "Dark Was the Night – Cold Was the Ground." She sings, while the Willie Johnson version mostly had his slide guitar sing the lyrics to a haunting effect, rather than his voice.
