Sol Roots Band has performed at many premier East Coast festivals and shared the stage with notable acts such as Shemekia Copeland, Robert Randolph, Jon Cleary, Dumpstaphunk and Booker T. Jones.

Sol teamed with vocal sensation Carly Harvey to form Carly & Sol, an acoustic duo that won the DCBS Duo/Solo Competition in September. The pair will represent DCBS next month at the 2017 International Blues Challenge in Memphis.

Carly Harvey is reminiscent of Etta James, with a voice and style that combine Blues, soul, jazz and Americana roots. She counts Bonnie Raitt, Nina Simone, Susan Tedeschi and Ella Fitzgerald among her many influences.

Doors open at 7pm, the music starts at 8pm, dinner is served at 9:30pm and the festivities continue until 12:30am. We welcome 2017 with a bluesy countdown and champagne toast at midnight. Blues Foundation Names 'Keeping Blues Alive' Recipients

Awards to be presented at 33rd Annual International Blues Challenge

Memphis' claim as the "Home of the Blues" will be indisputably evident the first week of February when The Blues Foundation hosts its 33rd Annual International Blues Challenge, attracting rising stars from throughout the world. The competition is set for Tuesday, Jan. 31 – Saturday, Feb. 4.

Musicians from around the globe will convene in Memphis to compete for cash, prizes, and bookings as they are judged the best in IBC categories, including Band, Solo/Duo, Electric Guitar, Acoustic Guitar, Harmonica Player and Self-Produced CD.

IBC alumni include such musicians as Susan Tedeschi, Tommy Castro, Delta Moon, Trampled Under Foot, Sean Costello and Grady Champion. Each year, The Blues Foundation presents the **Keeping the Blues Alive (KBA) Awards** to individuals and organizations that have made significant contributions to the Blues world. Presentation of the 2017 KBA Awards will be part of the International Blues Challenge (IBC) weekend of events.

Unlike the Blues Music Awards, which recognize the past year's best in recordings and performances, the KBAs are awarded to non-performers strictly on the basis of merit by a select panel of Blues professionals. KBA Chair Art Tipaldi notes "The KBA may be awarded for the recipient's work in the past year but most often reflects a lifetime of work; we don't view the recipient as the winner of a 'best of the year' category."

"Our 2017 Keeping the Blues Alive recipients are all wonderful examples of blues flame-keepers, each working in their own sphere of influence to move the genre forward while honoring its past," says Blues Foundation President and CEO Barbara Newman.

These honorees represent a broad spectrum of the music world: record labels, music festivals, recording studios, clubs, radio stations, publications and individuals with an undying passion to preserve and sustain the blues. They include grassroots blues heroes like Steve Salter, who created the nonprofit Killer Blues Headstone Project so that blues musicians wouldn't be buried in unmarked graves, and Eddie Stout, who is known as the "Ambassador of Texas Blues" for his work single-handedly running Dialtone Records.

The KBA's spotlight also shines on events like the Briggs Farm Blues Festival, which has been bringing the Mississippi Delta to eastern Pennsylvania for nearly 20 years, and Greaseland Studios, the San Jose recording studio where Kim Wilson, Maria Muldaur, Elvin Bishop, and Charlie Musselwhite have laid down tracks.

2017's KBA recipients not only cover America from coast-tocoast—from the Baltimore Blues Society to Seattle's Highway 99 Blues Club—but also reveal blues' international popularity. Wolf Records has been promoting Magic Slim and other Chicago blues acts for over 30 years, and they aren't doing it from Illinois, but Austria. The Chicago blues were also very important to 92 year old Jacques Morgantini, known as the Alan Lomax of Europe, who brought many American bluesmen to play in France. The Porretta Soul Festival. meanwhile, has turned a small Northern Italian town into a mecca of soul music, particularly the Memphis variety.

Joe Louis Walker Brings Legendary Blues Show to DCBS

The Silver Spring American Legion was the site of one of the best shows I have seen put on by the DC Blues Society (DCBS). On Friday, Oct. 14, Joe Louis Walker brought his outstanding band to a packed hall that was ready to have some fun with this blues legend. We don't often get an opportunity to see legendary performers this close up but we got it when Joe and his band kicked off the night and soon had the dance floor full of happy dancers.

Joe is an outstanding guitarist and soulful vocalist and was inducted into the Blues Hall of Fame in 2013. Over the years he has earned a total of 48 W.C. Handy/Blues Music Award nominations on his way to four wins including the Contemporary Blues Male Artist award at the 2016 Blues Music Awards. While having a long career, he is still creating new, exciting music as evidenced by the 2016 award.

The New York Times has raved,
"Walker is a singer with a Cadillac
of a voice. He delivers no-nonsense,
gutsy blues. His guitar solos are fast, wiry
and incisive, moaning with bluesy despair."
Rolling Stone simply calls him "ferocious."
After seeing Joe for the first time, I can
confirm those descriptions are true.

Joe brought his mix of blues, rock, soul and gospel to Silver Spring and demonstrated why fans and critics have been raving about him for so many years. With a career that goes back to the 1960s, Joe Louis Walker is one of trailblazers of the blues and has played

and recorded with everyone in the business. Joe played many songs from his new record, (it's his 24th record) *Everybody Wants a Piece*, and he has it on both CD and vinyl. One cover song that stood out was "Don't Let Go," played as an upbeat version with great harmonies from his band that had the crowd back up on the dance floor.

If you are a rock fan, a blues fan, a soul or funk fan, you don't want to miss a Joe Louis Walker show when he comes to your town because he can play it all. After the show, Joe waited for the fans, standing with his wife at the merchandise table happy to sign records and CDs and talk a bit before he had to get on the road on the way to the next show.

A personal highlight for me was working as a volunteer for the night and getting to meet Joe, his wife and the band and helping carry in his guitars and other equipment into the hall. Joe and the band seemed to really appreciate all of the DCBS volunteers who greeted him, helped set up the equipment, brought in dinner before

the show and made him feel at home and relaxed before playing such a hot show.

Thank you, Joe Louis Walker for coming to play for the DCBS, and we look forward to seeing you again soon!






