


Bad Influence

Bad Influence was one of the three co-winners of a WAMMIE Blues Album of the Year for their most recent album, Tastes Like Chicken on their BadBlues label. While this writer has never viewed the WAMA blues awards as generally indicative of the best blues in the DC area, this does not diminish the fact that this disc is a marvelous recording and deserving of accolades it has received such as from Eric Brace in the Washington Post's Weekend section. This is a fine album of original songs, although some of the melodies will suggest some classic blues tunes. It is particularly nice to hear a band that always showed that they could play come off as more than a cover band with all four lead vocalists, Michael 'Jr. Tash, Roger Edsall, Bob Mallardi and David Thaler, singing ably. The front-line of Jay Corder's sax along with Edsall's harp and Tash's guitar has a distinctive sound which they employ well and are able supported by a swinging rhythm section of bassist Mallardi and drummer Thaler. With the exception of the closing James Harman number, The Clown, the various songs are penned by members of the band and deal with computer love (Love Dot Com), coming home and finding his woman has gone and taken all his money too (She What?), blues about D.C. area drivers (D.C. Driver), and not having enough cash (Run to the Money). If occasionally the lyrics of a song may be a bit too localized for those outside the DC metro area (D.C. Driver), the songs do hold up and all three instrumentalists get to showcase their fine playing throughout without anybody overextending his musical welcome. Roger Edsall is one of the area's finest harp players, Jr. Tash shows himself to be a fluid, inventive player, and saxophonist Corder displays a nice fluid, full-bodied sound. Pete Kanaras of the Nighthawks guests on a track along with a backing chorus of Mary Shav-

er, Janine Wilson and Cindy Cain. The recording is quite good and holds up musically to the better blue wave bunch of bands like Little Charlie & the Nitecats or Rod Piazza & the Mighty Flyers. This is a solid recording that does not wear out its welcome with repeated listening.

Melanie Mason

Melanie Mason's self-produced, Bendin' the Blues, is another Wammie winner (Ray Kaminsky's Ghosts of the Blues, reviewed last month is the third co-winner). It is a bit more rock-laced a recording than Bad Influence and if not quite as satisfying a recording, it is also possibly a result of this being a debut album. She wrote most of the songs here although included a cover of John Lee Hooker's In the Mood, Mississippi John Hurt's Sliding Delta and Lowell Fulson's Bending Like a Willow Tree. Mason certainly sings strongly and plays guite well, even if the recording is a bit rock-laced. Her rhythm section rocks behind her but lacks the swing that Bad Influence plays. Her smoky vocals reminds this writer of Deborah Coleman, but Mason lacks the quirky phrasing that can make Ms. Coleman's singing an acquired taste. A couple of Mason's originals stand out, Work Your Magic and Love's Slow Burn. Her cover of John Lee Hooker's In the Mood has an fresh take but lacks the moody atmosphere of Hooker's classic original as well as Hooker's award winning duet with Bonnie Raitt. Sliding Delta has an almost country feel here. Benjie Porecki lent



his keyboard talents to the session and is firstrate as always and Mickey Meiklejohn's harmonica playing was also a delight throughout. A solid debut that displays much more than simply promise.

The Deacons

While not one of the co-winners, The latest disc by The Deacons, Maiden America, was a nominee for Best Blues album and certainly merits attention. Featuring John O'Connor's bass and vocals, this egalitarian guartet at one time also featured Chris Polk before evolving into its present line-up of O'Connor; Geoffrey Holdridge on electric viola and vocals: Bruce Middle, guitar and vocals; and Charles Mitchell, drums and vocals. This album caught the group in transition as a little more than half has the guitar of Mike Dutton who plays a strong bluesy style very suggestive of classic B.B. King. Middle, who has a diverse and varied background including a stint with jazz and blues vocalist Juanita Williams, makes use of various devices allowing him to come across as an accordion or keyboard when the band is live and several sides here hint at how the Deacons have evolved from simply being a blues band into a group that mixes jazz, funk and world music into an irresistible groove. One of their hottest numbers live is a rendition of Roy Montrell's I Love the Sound of the Mellow Saxophone, in which the group seques into Duke Ellington's Caravan during the instrumental portion of the performance. Holdridge who pointedly tells listeners his influence is Stuff Smith adds some wonderful voicings and riffs behind the vocals or the guitar solos. O'Connor who takes many of the vocals certainly sings with considerable presence on standard blues numbers like Angel of the Airways or Why Me? Songs like Mona, with its irresistible reggae groove, certainly do not fall within a typical twelve-bar pattern and in fact suggest Talking

Heads more than Muddy Waters. A bit more of classic R&B infuses Everybody's Somebody's Baby. This is a marvelously varied and performed album of all originals, with The Deacons' unique instrumentation allowing them to follow some unexpected musical directions. Maiden America is a snapshot of their evolution and well worth seeking out at their gigs.



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
