EVENT BENEFITS THE METROPOLITAN POLICE BOYS AND GIRLS CLUBS

Bob Margolin

Steady Rollin' Bob Margolin continues to play in the style of blues he played with Muddy Waters two decades after that legend's death. He has added to his growing discography with a new Telarc disc , Bob Margolin's All Star Blues Jam. The disc brings together Carey Bell, Hubert Sumlin, Pinetop Perkins, Willie Smith and Jimmy Lane for renditions of mostly classic blues tunes. It was recorded mostly at the Blues Heaven Studio in Salina Kansas, and captures the classic Chicago blues sound of Waters and others with Margolin sharing the vocals with Waters band veterans Perkins, Bell, and Willie Smith, and bassist Mookie Brill. Smith, longtime drummer with Muddy does a first-rate job on Waters' Country Boy and plays harmonica on the reworking of *Juke*. Pinetop's steady piano helps anchor much of this disc along with Brill on bass and Smith on drums. Margolin tackles Johnny Shines' Brutal Hearted Woman, which he has rearranged the number into a Waters' styled Chicago blues, but vocally cannot come close to Shines' singing on the original. Bell is typically solid throughout whether playing fat chromatic harp behind Smith's vocal on Always on My Mind or singing, with his familiar gruff delivery, on the shuffle One Day You'll Gonna

Get Lucky. Pinetop ably does Robert Nighthawk's Sweet Black Angel. A live recording of Mean Old Chicago, a song Margolin

wrote, in memory of Jimmy Rogers, includes some nice guitar from Lane, Rogers' son. Sumlin is present supporting Margolin on Jimmy Rogers' Last Time and the blues staple Goin'Down Slow. The album closes with an instrumental rendition of the gospel standard Just a Little Walk With You that Pinetop takes the lead on with a simply delivered rendition. There is a solid consistency in the performances and if there are few exceptional ones, the level of those here makes for enjoyable listening that will not disappoint fans of classic Chicago blues.

Smokin' Joe Kubek

After a number of well-regarded discs for Bullseye Blues, Smokin' Joe Kubek and Bnois King have a new disc, **Roadhouse Research**, on Blind Pig. The Texas pair combine Kubek's muscular guitar playing with King's soulful singing (suggestive of a cool Otis Rush) and slightly jazzier fretwork and tasteful rhythm playing. The contrast of Kubek's in-your-face guitar and King's vocals make for an appealing combination. It is unsettling to hear King's slightly distorted vocals on the opening *Healthy Mama* while Kubek's soloing on *Crying Shame* would not have sounded out-of-place on some pyschedelic recordings three decades ago. The ten originals include some typical lyrical

themes about hard times, women and the philosophical *Better Be Getting It On,* a hot shuffle where King tells us the while life my seem like a mystery, one better can a move on with Kubek taking a strong, blistering solo. Kubek pulls all the stops on the slow blues, *Runnin' Blind,* before King sings about having his woman running through his mind, but moving way too fast. *Make It Right* has a nice latin groove and a bit laid back feel for King's plea that all he needs is his woman to make it right. Adding to the album's variety is Kubek's forceful slide playing on *I Need More.* Kubek is such a strong player that he can avoid the excesses that might otherwise have his tone and frenetic fretwork come off as overbearing and also maintains an ear out as King sings so he never overwhelms the performance. The result here is a varied disc.

Warner Williams - Jay Summerour

I finally was able to get a copy of the disc from Warner Williams and Jay Summerour', Little Bit of Blues (Patuxent) when they appeared at the Columbia Pike Blues Festival. Anyone who knows this writer, knows that I consider them among the D.C. area's unsung musical treasures. This disc does a wonderful job of presenting them on a collection of songs that will be familiar to those who have seen them perform. It only suggests the extent of Mr. Williams' extensive repertoire, but songs like Good Mornin' Little School Girl, Key to the Highway, Big Bug in My Beer, Shanty in Old Shantytown, I Got a Letter (a retitled version of Big Bill Broonzy's I Feel So Good), C.C. Rider, Froggy Went a Courtin', Step It Up and Go, and Diggin' My Potatoes. Williams is such a magical guitarist with his unique variation of the Piedmont guitar style while Summerour's harp, clapping and backup vocals provides all the support Williams might need. One would be hard-pressed to find anyone whose spirits would not be lifted by Williams' wonderful playing and buoyant singing. Available at their performances and better local stores, including I understand Joe's Record Paradise and a must for all area blues lovers

Maybe its in the genes, but Erin Harpe, daughter of longtime area bluesman, Neil Harpe, has produced a wonderful album of acoustic blues, Blues Roots. The disc is on Juicy Juju Records. the label that Lovewhip, the Boston-based world pop band she fronts, records for. Erin displays considerable command of a wide range of blues including songs associated with Memphis Minnie (Chauffeur Blues and In My Girlish Days), Tommy Johnson (Bye and Bye Blues and Big Road Blues). Bessie Smith (Alligator Blues), Willie Brown (Future Blues) and others. She plays a strong, percussive-tinged guitar that suits these songs perfectly but also able to nimbly fingerpick on a Blind Blake number, You Gonna Quit Me. She delivers her vocals with a strong, straightforward and natural delivery that is quite appealing and is reminiscent of longtime D.C. area blueswoman, Eleanor Ellis, who is credited with the closing Stop and Listen Blues. This is a fine debut album of traditional country blues that is available through www.cdbaby.com, and can also be accessed through Lovewhip's website, www.lovewhip.net.

Kenny "Blue' Ray

West coast guitarist Kenny 'Blue' Ray has been growing a reputation for his strong guitar playing over the past few years on a series of discs on his own labels. His latest, **Got Blues** (Blue Kat), brings together some strong originals and covers that display Ray's wonderful tone and playing. Ray'



shows a fair bit of influence of Albert Collins and Albert King. What sets him apart from many guitar slingers today is his taste and economy whether evoking John Lee Hooker on Goodbye Johnny or tossing in some blistering flurry of notes mixed in with long sustained ones in a blend of the two Alberts. His band here varies throughout and includes some solid vocals by Charlie Chavez, who is also an able harp player. Stan Powell plays some strong chromatic harp (especially on You Belong to Me). Tributes to John Lee Hooker, in which the group evokes the slow groove of the late King of the Boogie, and Buddy Guy are mixed in with covers of songs from Louisiana Red, Too Poor to Die: Sonny Boy Williamson Mr. Downchild; Magic Sam, You Belong to Me and Everythings Gonna Be Alright: Buster Brown, Fannie Mae; and Robert Johnson, Stop Breaking Down, on which Ray sings. Ray is one of those individuals playing the music away from even the spotlight a national independent label provides yet has produced a strong disc deserving of wider exposure. Even better is Ray's last cd, Soulful Blues (Tone King) which features the highly underrated singer Jackie Payne on a terrific collection of modern




