

W.C. Clark

With several excellent albums for Black Top and now Alligator, Austin's W.C. Clark has built up an impressive catalog of soulful modern urban blues. Clark, brings a strong fluent guitar style that shows influences from T-Bone Walker and Steve Cropper to go with his soulful singing. These aspects of his music are demonstrated on his new Alligator c.d. **Deep in the Heart**, where he is joined by the likes of guitarists Derek O'Brien and Pat Boyack, Kaz Kazanoff and the Texas Horns, and keyboardist, Riley Osbourn. There are also vocal duets with Marcia Ball and Ruthie Foster. An overly simplified description of this recording's feel might be as a mix of Joe Tex, Al Green, Jimmy McCracklin and T-Bone Walker. There is an impressive reading of Joe Tex's I Want to Do Everything For You (duet with Ruthie Foster), and the two duets with Marcia Ball, You Left the Water Running and Soul Kind of Feeling, are nicely done. A Clark-Kazanoff original Cold Blooded Lover is a strong shuffle with fleet guitar picking that evokes, but does not imitate, T-Bone Walker's sound. The opening track, Stronger Than You Need to Be, has a lyric where Clark tells a lady that because someone hurt her is no reason to not give him her love, while Tip of My Tongue is a bluesy soul ballad from John Hiatt with nicely placed guitar lines in his accompaniment. Clark gets in a funky groove on his original Jaded Lady, which is followed by the Jimmy Reed

groove on *Ain't Lost Nothin'*. The disc ends with a driving treatment of Gatemouth Brown's *Okie Dokie Stomp*. As a vocalist, Clark may not quite reach heaven as in the manner of Al Green, but delivers his vocals in a heartfelt fashion that consistently rings true. With the consistently strong performances and the varied music here, Clark has produced a disc that will make some best of 2004 blues lists. W.C. Clark is a tremendous live performer and his performance at last summer's Pocono Blues Festival was one of that events' highlights as he sang and played his heart out despite a heavy rain. He will be appearing at this month's Hot August Blues on the 21st and should not be missed.

Melanie Mason

Melanie Mason, winner of the Society's Battle of the Bands at last year's DC Blues Festival has just released an acoustic blues c.d., **Lonesome Is I**. With performances of songs associated with Robert Johnson, Mississippi John Hurt, Reverend Robert Wilkins and Mance Lipscomb along with two originals, Mason has brought together material that one imagines must be favorites of her, but a number of these songs have been interpreted so often that it is hard for this recording to standout. That



said, there are several positives about this recording. For one thing, these are acoustic blues performances, not simply unplugged renditions of songs. She is particularly strong on guitar when working in more of a finger picking vein although her renditions of Robert Johnson' songs shows her talent, even if her playing is not as skilled as the original recordings. The renditions of John Hurt songs are particularly nice as are her originals, and never is her delivery heavyhanded. A banjo was added to the rendition Robert Wilkins The Prodigal Son, although I would suggest you to find Wilkins' Newport performance of the song to appreciate just how remarkable Wilkins was. In fact go back to his original blues using this melody, That's No Way to Get Along which I believe is available on a Yazoo reissue. While occasionally Melanie's vocals come off a little affected (as on Johnson's Preachin' Blues, Melanie delivers the songs with heart and warmth, and within its limitations, this disc does provide a number of pleasures.

Nick Curran

Nick Curran and the Nitelifes won this year's Handy Award for new artist. Blind Pig has just issued their second album, **Player**, which should appeal to fans of fifties-styled blues, R&B and rock. Curran does a more than credible job of evoking the past whether with the wild, shattering Ike Turner flavored guitar on the title track with a equally shattering vocal, whereas *Honey Bee* is a slightly frenzied jump blues

with some hot guitar and What About Love is another R&B rocker with more idiomatic guitar, and a bit of Billy Gayles in the vocal. Curran's recreation of T-Bone Walker's Evenin' is patterned on the original but Curran has a bit edgier tone to his guitar than Walker's immaculate guitar on the original. Kim Wilson adds his harp to the gulf coast flavored rocking blues She's Evil which is taken at a perfect swing dance tempo. Wilson is also present for the interpretation of Little Walter's recording Crazy Mixed Up World. Curran's versatility is reflected on The Groovy Jam, a jump instrumental which shows that Curran has more than a slight familiarity with such neglected guitar masters as Tiny Grimes and Al Casey. No Fun transforms an Iggy Pop song into a fifties jump blues sizzler. This a splendid album which benefits from Curran's use of fresh new material and covers of lesser known songs to provide for some very entertaining music which salutes the blues of fifty years ago without being slavish copies of such material. A very nice sophomore effort by this Texas-based talent. Nick has been performing regularly in the DC Baltimore area and will be performing at the Baltimore Blues Society's Alonzo's Memorial Picnic on Sunday, September 5.

takes place September 11 at Colonial Beach VA. More details in our September issue.


