Cephas & Wiggins **Headline Festival Fundraiser**

The DC Blues Society invites you to attend our Festival Fundraiser. It takes place Thursday June 8 at The Dennis & Phillip Ratner Museum 10001 Old Georgetown Road, Bethesda, MD. Featured will be DC's legendary acoustic blues duo, John Cephas & Phil Wiggins (pictured at 2005 Western Maryland Blues Festival) followed by a wine and

cheese reception. The fundraiser is from 7 to 9:30PM with the show starting promptly at 7:00PM. Tickets cost \$35.00 and there is

limited seating.

John Cephas & Phil Wiggins have formed one of the most enduring blues duos over the past thirty-odd years, and have a reputation as among the finest acoustic blues performers in the world, winning a number of Handy Awards (now called the Blues Music Awards) as well as countless WAMMIES.

John Cephas is among the finest living practioners of the finglestyle guitar, playing in the tradition of Rev. Gary Davis, Blind Boy Fuller and John Jackson. As a vocalist he can remind one of the legendary big Bill Broonzy with the warmth and depth of feeling her projects. He has not limited himself to Piedmont blues classic sand is an able and unique interpreter of the music of Skip James.

Phil Wiggins, started playing with the likes of Mother Scott and Flora Molton before forming the Barrelhouse Trio with Cephas and the late blues pianist, Big Chief Ellis. He is recognized as one of the finest harmonica players in the blues, not simply acoustic blues and is a very gifted songwriter. They were among the ffounders of the DC Blues Society and John Cephas was the Society's first President and Phil Wiggins also served on the Board of Directors and as an officer. They have recorded a number of acclaimed albums and presently record for Alligator Records. There latest album was, **Somebody Told the Truth**, although they are among those featured in live performance on Mark Hummel's Blues Harmonica Meltdown Volume 3, Legends, along with Carey Bell and Lazy Lester.

Road Report
Watermelon Slim Caught Live

To many Blues fans, Bill Homans a.k.a. Watermelon Slim is a known celebrity and according to various sources, is a MENSA member, holder of Bachelor & Graduate degrees and until a recent heart attack, a professional truck driver. He is a complex and engaging Blues performer and I'd like to share some moments from the first Newton (NC) Blues Fest held recently on April 28 & 29 where Slim's venue was the Catawba County Courthouse courtroom!

In the basement was the Catawba County museum's special exhibit containing the personal effects of local residents, who like Slim, had served in the Vietnam War. Slim remarked that visiting this exhibit had helped him exorcise some demons and he downplayed his own participation saying: I was in the Army and didn't get to real dangerous areas as so many other US servicemen did. After his return from Vietnam, Slim initially pursued a musical career and he relayed the story as to how he was playing harp at a club in Chicago when Sonny Boy Williamson came on stage, took the harp from Slim and launched into an impressive set. When this set ended, James Cotton grabs the harmonica and embarks on a mind-blowing set. Slim's lament was that he doesn't have that harmonica to donate to Clarksdale's Blues Museum.

<u>Watermelon Slim</u> (April 27)- This was a solo acoustic set with Slim alternating between harp (Chicago Baritone Sax as he calls it) and extensive slide guitar work on his Dobro. Much of the material was from his 2005 CD release: **Up Close & Personal**, whose cover shows a blue & white Freightliner of Slim's former employer. Interestingly,

while playing slide guitar he remarked that he's unable to play chords anymore. He uses various slides ((empty airline liquor bottles were among his favorites) including copper pipe and other bottles donated by his fans.

Watermelon Slim and the Workers (April 28) Dressed in a white suit with a string tie, Slim looked to be the brethren of the many portraits hanging on the courtroom walls. With the Workers providing bass, guitar and drums, this was definitely an electrified set! Early in this performance, the crowd began to sprout dancers; eventually there were a multitude of folks dancing in the courtroom's aisles. Overall, this



set contained many tracks from his latest album: Watermelon Slim & The Workers. The night finished up with an outrageous performance of: *Hey Bo Diddley*.

Watermelon Slim leaves one awe-struck by the tremendous energy he invests into each and every song. If you find yourself at a Watermelon Slim concert, please insure that someone in the audience raises their hand in acknowledgement when Slim canvasses the audience for fellow truck drivers. His eyes get a special quality when he locates that person and there is an unspoken bond.

I traveled over six hours from the DC Metro area to see Watermelon Slim and the Workers and I surely was not disappointed!

Smithsonian Folklife Festival Having Special New Orleans Shows

The Smithsonian Folklife Festival is having a special evening concert series, Been in the Storm So Long, that will feature African-American musical traditions from the region devastated by Hurricane Katrina. Produced in collaboration with the National Museum of African American History and Culture, the concerts will present New Órleans jazz, brass bands, rhythm & blues, Mardi Gras Indians, and gospel. The three concerts, held on the evenings of June 30, July 7, and July 8, celebrate the perseverance of the musicians of New Orleans despite the devastation of Hurricane Katrina. The concerts are:
