# New Orleans Blues Queen, Marva Wright, Headlines Free 18th Annual DC Blues Festival

Also - Memphis Gold & Robert Lighthouse The DC Blues Society in conjunction with the National Park Service and the Carter Barron Amphitheatre, is proud to present the 18th Annual DC Blues Festival. The Festival takes place on Saturday September 2 and Marva Wright, the Blues Queen of New Orleans will headline this day of blues. Others on the bill which will in part spotlight the music of New Orleans include Memphis Gold, Robert Lighthouse, the Junkyard Saints, Terence McArdle & Jumpin' Tonight and the winners of the Society's 2005 Battle of the Bands, The Westcott Brothers.

**Marva Wright** has been a fixture in the French Quarter who relocated near Baltimore along with most of her family (one son, a New Orleans police officer remained there) after the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina. This Bluesiana Mama was inspired after seeing Koko Taylor to sing the blues and has been wowing audiences ever since. With fans that include Sixty Minutes Ed Bradley, she will display her powerful singing as she wonders who has no



drawers on. Her band, the BMWs includes bassistleader Benny Turner, Freddie King's nephew.

**Robert Lighthouse**, a Swedish native, I has been a fixture in DC for about two decades. From busking on the street as a one-man band mixing in some interpretations of Robert Johnson, Muddy Waters and Dr. Ross , he also spent some time playing in Charlie Sayles Band. He was the winner of the initial DC Blues Society Battle of Bands in the early nineties winning at the First National Capital Barbecue Battle which was held at RFK Station's parking lot back in the early nineties. Wayne Kahn included Robert in the first volume of his Blues You Hate To Lose and then issued a full CD of Robert on his Right on Rhythm label mixing some of Robert's originals along with covers from Dr. Ross and others such as John Brim's *Ice Cream Man*. Robert for years had a weekly gig at the lamented and missed club, **City Blues,** and recently has been featured regularly at a number of rooms including JVs and Bangkok Blues and has a weekly gig presently at Chief Ike's Mambo Room in Adams Morgan. Wayne Kahn is currently recording Robert's performances with the intention of getting a new CD released by this talented blues performer.

**Memphis Gold**, real name Chester Chandler, came to the attention of many competing at the DC Blues Society's Battle of the Bands before gaining the attention of blues fans at a variety of clubs including JVs, the long-defunct Smokehouse Blue and Whitlow's on Wilson when it first




opened, as well as for several Society shows over the years. He was long part of Memphis' blues scene when the legendary Robert Wilkins mentored him and later he developed his skills performing with such Memphis institutions as The Fieldstones. He has become one of the area's most talented blues performers although he has limited his local performances in recent gigs, now doing a fair amount of touring on USO tours where this Veteran entertains the troops. He has two CDs, the most

recent one, **The Prodigal Son**, with some choice originals got rave write-ups in publications such as **Blues & Rhythm** and was selected as among the best blues CDs of 2004. The oldest continuously published blues magazine, **Jefferson**, had a cover feature on him, and recently Living Blues founder Jim O'Neal signed Memphis Gold to his label, reflecting an appreciation for Memphis Gold's real deal blues.

Other Main-Stage Festival performers include The Junkyard Saints, who return to present their mix of New Orleans and cajun-zydeco sounds. The winners of the DCBS' 2005 Battle of the Blues, The Westcott Brothers, impress with their swinging modern blues sounds with soulful organ and strong guitar. Terence McArdle is a local music historian as well as guitarist-vocalist. His story on Bobby Parker was one of the first published accounts on DC's leading contemporary bluesman. Even moreso he is a strong guitarist with a foundation in the blues tradition with an appreciation



of rockabilly and other roots players who can bring his own touch to an old **Pee Wee Crayton** number as his own jump



blues styled originals. Terence was a member of the **Uptown Rhythm Kings** among other bands and his self-produced CD has received considerable praise locally and nationally.

In addition to these performers, there will be workshops, activities for children and do not forget the Festival After-Party which will be at the Surf Club after the Festival. It will start at 8:30 and feature Dr. S.O. Feelgood (Chet Hines) and many special guests. Advance tickets are \$8 members, \$10 nonmembers and Festival

volunteers get in free.

We are looking for volunteers for the Festival. Be a Festival Volunteer to get a personal invitation to the Volunteer Appreciation Pool Party and much more! See the separate article on volunteers.

This will be one of the signature events of the Society's 20th year so we look forward to seeing you there.





## **Cephas & Wiggins**

The release of the new Alligator CD, Shoulder to Shoulder by (John) Cephas & (Phil) Wiggins will certainly be welcome by lovers of acoustic blues lovers everywhere, not simply here in the DC area. The two are in usual fine form with Cephas assured guitar and Wiggins remarkable crying harmonica. Ann Rabson adds piano to six tracks while Daryl Davis is heard on one. It opens when a fine Cephas original, Ain't Seen My Baby that shows off Cephas Piedmont guitar style, and closes with a blues taken from Robert Johnson's Walking Blues, The Blues Three Ways on which Daryl Davis adds some solid piano. In between the pair rework Skip James recording of the Delta classic Catfish Blues, on which Cephas shows himself to be one of the most consistently able interpreters of James' music. Another highpoint is Cephas' Piedmont reworking of Charlie Patton's deep delta blues, Dirt Road, with Rabson's piano adding to the tunes flavor. Seattle Rainy Day Blues is another standout original with a wonderful lyric and solid piano from Rabson behind the two. The performances are consistently strong with the piano especially lending a bit more city feel to some of these excellent performances in what is another excellent addition to their body of recordings.

## Lil' Ed & the Blues Imperials


When Lil Ed Williams & the Blues Imperials come to town, one can expect an evening of some houserocking blues and boogie. This is also true of their recordings as Lil 'Ed, with his declamatory vocals and driving slide guitar, and the hard rocking Blues Imperials may not be masters of subtlety but play the blues to lift your spirits and get your feet tapping. Their latest Alligator disc, **Rattleshake**, is no exception. Opening with Holland & Dozier's *Leaving* 

*Here*, Lil' Ed mixes some hard rocking numbers with a few slow blues where he sings his heart out. There are strong covers of Elmore James' *You Know You're Wrong*, and *That's the Truth*, from his uncle J.B. Hutto and amusing originals like *lcicles in My Meatloaf*, where this fine lady took him home but there were some strange things on his plate. Perhaps the Billy Joe Shaver number *Tramp on Your Street*, does not come off totally successful but overall this is another houserocking disc by Lil Ed & the Blues Imperials and easily recommended.

## Ellis, Ellis & Cohen

Eleanor Ellis is a local DC treasure, being among the most gifted female purveyors of old time blues in the area. She has championed the likes of the late Flora Molton and Archie Edwards, helped found the DC Blues Society and similarly helped with the Archie Edwards Blues Heritage Foundation after he passed. She has recorded infrequently, often in a supporting role, so when longunavailable recordings with Bill Ellis (no relation) and Andy Cohen became available, it is cause for celebration. The CD is **Preachin' in the Wilderness, Country Blues Classics** on Cohen's Riverlark label. There are twenty two performances included with all three taking vocals. Cohen gets to display his mastery of Rev. Gary Davis' fingerstyle guitar and other pre-war blues styles, whereas Bill Ellis

takes the lead on several as well as contributes originals and Eleanor handles Memphis Minnie's In My Girlish Days, duets with Bill Ellis on Leroy Carr's Midnight Hour Blues, and handles Sleepy John Estes' Leaving Trunk. Other performances derive from Casey Bill Weldon, Washington Phillips, 'Ragtime Texas' Henry Thomas, Simmie Dooley & Pink Anderson, Larry Johnson, Brownie McGhee, Gus Cannon and the wonderful Hungry Blues, words by Langston Hughes and music from James P. Johnson which is marvelously sung by Eleanor with Bill on guitar and Andy on piano. The level of the musicianship is marvelous and perhaps the best known of these songs may be Spoonful, taken from Mance Lipscomb's Arhoolie recording although it is familiar from renditions by John Hurt and Charlie Patton. Amazingly, or thankfully, there were no covers of Robert Johnson tunes although I suspect any could do one that would actually be worth hearing. Cohen has other recordings on Riverlark while William Lee Ellis has a new release on Yellow Dog. Eleanor is still criminally underrepresented on disc, but alas we have this marvelous disc to savor.

#### **Songs of Peace & Forgiveness**

Eleanor Ellis is among the 16 artists who each have contributed to **Songs of Peace & Forgiveness.** It is subtitled as **Blues Musicians Bring peace Through Music** and is "A Benefit recordings For the Archie Edwards Blues Heritage Foundation. Eleanor is heard on William Lee (Bill) Ellis' *Trouble I Once Knew* and its one of the most compelling acoustic blues performances I have heard in some time. This is an uneven collection (ranging from simply good to sublime) and despite its subtitle, there are gospel and folk (such as Alex Radus' *Disorganized Religion* and Mark Kinneburgh's *Peace and Forgiveness*) as well as blues performed. Roddy Barnes has a nice original, *Better World*, with its hopes, and

Phil Wiggins and Mark Puryear has a wonderful rendition of Wiggins' Cool Down, with its message for people to chill out. I had not heard pianist Kelley Hunt before, but her The Next Step, will have me check out more by her. Gospel is represented by M.S.G.'s *Come to Me in Prayer* while Alison Radcliffe plays a simple piano to accompany her haunting vocal on I Want Jesus to Walk With Me. Husband Allen Holmes takes a marvelous harmonica solo although the performance runs a bit long. Still, what a voice she has. There are also contributions from Andra Faye and the Mighty Good Men, BluesWorks, Mike Baytop, Grant Dermody and Frank Fotufsy, and Scott Ainslie. The album closes with Ray Kaminsky's marvelous rendition of Amazing Grace. Not only is there some good music here, but the CD will help preserve the Barbershop whose building is being sold. #### **BT Richardson**

A surprise attending the June jam was the set led by bassist BT Richardson. Richardson is a multi-talented performer who has played with and toured with famous artists in blues, R&B, jazz and more. He has produced **Don't Sing No More Blues For Me**,

music from and inspired by the Glenn Alan play which on the basis of this CD certainly sounds quite interesting. The nine performances here include three field variations on Oh Mama, almost a field holler; two modern electric blues Hot Damn Mama and Bad Luck Woman along with a soulful ballad (Ooh Baby) Don't Take Your Love Away, and the title track, a Keb'Mo like folk-blues acoustic number. Despite some multi-tracking, fortunately Richardson eschews the use of a rhythm track and the music has life and displays his strong vocals (and what a surprise was to hear him singing at the jam) along with cast members Bobby Malone, Betty Entzminger and Michael Holland. A bonus track, The Big Job, is a solid reggae number that Richardson sounds fine on. This is an intriguing and entertaining recording and Richardson's solid production as well as his strong singing suggests he is a talent DC area blues and music fans will become much more aware of. 
#### Big G

Based on his performance at a recent southern soul show at Lamont's, this writer understands why Richmond's Big G has developed a following among fans of the soul-blues in the Mid-Atlantic and Southeast. He has produced a number of CDs on his own which are typical of such efforts

in that there is considerable use of overdubbing and the em-

ployment of a rhythm track as opposed to a live drummer. Big G is a more than capable guitarist and keyboard player and a very soulful singer. Despite the self-imposed limitations, his newest CD, Broken Hearted will appeal to his fans and even more casual fans of the music. The title track is a nice ballad evoking the swamp pop era with Big G's tear-in-the-throat vocal aided by the sparse production. Freaky Groove is a seductive song as he tells his woman how much she means to him and how he wants to get freaky with her that night. Two Step (on which rapper 100 Proof appears) is a party dance song, presented in a radio version and a longer club mix. One number, Family Reunion Slide, is an instrumental whereas the remainder are standard soul-blues that are well written and sung. The material and Big G's own singing deserves a bit more time and production effort so that it would be easier for him to have broader appeal. ## **Bill Lupkin And Friends**

Prior to hearing to **Where I Come From** (Blue Bella), I had never heard of Bill Lupkin. He's made his way to the bright lights and big city of Chicago clubs in the late 1960s. Mark Hummel's liner notes got my attention, and photos of Bill playing with Johnny Littlejohn, Muddy Waters, Howlin' Wolf, and Jimmy Rogers told me that I

had a big gap in my blues education. Jimmy Dawkins and Hubert Sumlin were there, along with Lefty Dizz a who's who of Chicago blues. On *The Sun is Shinin'*; Bill had me with his big fat harp tones buoyed by Mark Fornek's drums, Harlan Terson's bass, and Nick Moss' guitar. I kicked back and enjoyed the work of a seasoned player who's worthy of comparisons to James Cotton and Junior Wells (a mentor to Bill). An outstanding Blue Bella CD; Chicago blues continues to burn brightly with Bill Lupkin's return to the scene. **Eric Steiner** 

## Nick Moss And The Flip Tops

Ever since I discovered Chicago bluesman Nick Moss on his Blues Award-nominated **Sadie Mae**, I've always looked forward to a live CD. This year, Blues Foundation members nominated **Sadie Mae** in both the Album of the Year and Traditional Album of the Year categories. **Live at Chan's** (Blue Bella) captures Nick Moss and the Flip Tops and some special guests live last summer, and the eight minutes of Eggroll Stroll leads the 76-minute set. Many of the songs on **Live at Chan's** feature long blues jams, just like Nick's live shows. Monster Mike Welch sits in on Just Like That, it's a treat to hear Mike and Nick balance with Gerry Hundt's powerful harmonica work. **Live at Chan's** offers 76 minutes of highenergy blues that's faithful to the postwar Chicago sound, and I hope he'll take home the hardware for this CD in Memphis next May. **Eric Steiner**

The latest edition of **The Nighthawks** has issued a CD/DVD of a live Wolf Trap Barns performance, **Blue Moon in Your Eye** (Rolling Storm Communications). This may be the first recording of the present lineup of harpist Mark Wenner and drummer Pete Raguso joined by guitarist Paul Bell and bassist Johnny Castle. The present edition of the band is as good as any and anyone who has seen them knows what to expect as they run through a program of blues classics, rock'n'roll, country and rockabilly in the band's style. Morning (Theme Song From the Sopranos) they tackle such familiar items as Born in Chicago, Chuck Berry's Thirty Days, Johnny Cash's Big River (also recently redone by Charlie Musselwhite although this version is a bit more rockabilly here), Bo Diddley's You Don't Love Me (You Don't Care), Willie Dixon's Same Thing, Carl Perkins' Put Your Cat Clothes On, and the country classic made famous by Patsy Cline, Walkin' After Midnight. There is little musically in terms of surprises here and is a pretty typical set of houserocking music by the epitome of touring bar bands. There is plenty of strong harp from Wenner and Bell can get down in the alley on a slow blues and rock out on Thirty Days and the vocals throughout are solid. A bonus is the DVD of the same performance that is included at no extra cost. The Hawks play so much around town that it should be easy to get one but I believe cdbaby.com does carry this.

#### **Blues Harp Meltdown Volume 3**

Cephas & Wiggins also heard on **Blues Harp Meltdown Vol. 3 Legends** (Mountain Top), the third cd documenting Mark Hummel's annual harp tour. Recorded in January 2004, Hum-



mel brought to the tour guitarist Steve Freund, drummer-harmonica player Willie 'Big Eyes' Smith, Cephas & Wiggins, Carey Bell & Lazy Lester for a smorgasbord of blues stylings. Hummel is a formidable harp player and revives a Lloyd Price Crescent City rocker Where Y'at along with Little Walter's Roller Coaster followed by Freund (singing two numbers) and Smith who ably handles Hoodoo Man Blues.

*Cephas & Wiggins* are typically fine on an instrumental, Fats Domino's *Going to the River* and Robert Johnson's *Walkin' Blues*. The second disc has strong performances by Bell including *It Ain't Right* and *I'm Ready* while Lazy Lester handles his *Blues Stop Knocking*, Slim Harpo's *Raining in My Heart* and his *Sugar Coated Love*. Freund plays on Bell's selections and Hummel's band able supports all except those by Cephas & Wiggins. Blues harp fans will find plenty of music to entertain them here.

## **Texas Harmonica Rumble**

Another collection of performances by several harmonica players is Texas Harmonica Rumble (DialTone). It collects performances by Orange Jefferson, Lazy Lester, Bobby Rush, Sammy Myers, Mel Davis and Joe Jonas, backed by solid groups, except for Orange Jefferson who is backed by guitarist Thierry Cognee. Orange Jefferson's two tracks are the most down home with his Hey Warden! reflecting his real life experiences as Thierry adds some crackling Texas guitar with echoes of Hopkins and Frankie Lee Sims as Jefferson's own harp supports his vocal. Lazy Lester handles a couple of Chicago blues classics, That's All *Right* and *Honest I Do*, in his amiable style. Bobby Rush reworks Willie Mabon's Poison Ivy and Little Walter's Temperature (called Hot Tempter here) in straightforward performances. Sammy Myers does a brisk instrumental Brain Dean and Otis Spann's It Must Have Been the Devil. Mel Davis, a fine singer with a rocking shuffle I Love My Baby with a bit more urbane vocal and solid playing suggesting Junior Wells and Joe Jonas whose Sonny Boy styled harp and vigorous singing are exemplified by Blues From Beaumont Texas. Guitarist Little Joe Washington fronts Jonas for Take Off Your Shoes. This fine collection and the Blues Harp Meltdown is available from www.bluebeatmusic.com and other stores.
